SHOWMANSHIP-Can be western or English attire BUT horse must be shown in a halter. Participants will be judged on how well they show their horse, not on confirmation. Pattern class

HALTER-Can be western or English attire BUT horse must be shown in a halter. Horses will be judged on confirmation.

DRESSAGE: Please bring 2 printed copies of your selected tests and turn in at the office when you check in.

ENGLISH/WESTERN EQUITATION evaluates the rider's posture, position, balance, and ability to control the horse rather than the horse itself. Rail class

ENGLISH RIDING classes are rail classes judged on both horse and rider, working together as a team to follow judges instruction.

ENGLISH HORSEMANSHIP- pattern class

WESTERN PLEASURE Contestants compete simultaneously, traveling the perimeter of the arena, and at the discretion of the judge, are asked to walk, jog, lope and reverse the direction of the horse. Horses are evaluated on quality of movement while staying quiet and calm, traveling on a loose rein.

HUNTER/JUMPER For the .60, .65m and .70m classes, these are run as Optimum Time classes. The rider with the fewest faults and the ride closest to the posted Optimum Time wins. For the .80m and above classes, the rider with the fewest faults and fastest time wins. reference MHJA Table II Sec. 2(b) *Denotes MHJA-rated jumper classes eligible for MHJA year-end points in accordance with current MHJA rules and specifications. Hunter classes are offered as individual classes rather than divisions. These classes are eligible for MHJA year-end points. All such points are separate from the 406 Show Series High Point Divisions.

PEEWEE- Participant can be lead line or under supervision-- Meaning able to ride independently with capable helper staying within arm's length for safety. Peewee Riding will be run as a rail class, horsemanship will be a simple pattern. Can be English or Western Tack

RANCH RIDING- Ranch riding is **a class that simulates a horse and rider working on a ranch**, with natural and forward gaits, a relaxed and versatile attitude. The class consists of a pattern that includes required and optional maneuvers, such as changes of gait, extension of gait, crossing logs, and lead changes. Will be following AQHA rules, regulations and scoring.

WORKING WESTERN RAIL class measures the ability of the horse to be a pleasure to ride and should reflect the versatility, attitude, and movement of a working horse. The horse should be well-broke, relaxed, quiet, soft and cadenced at all gaits. The movement of the working western rail horse should simulate a horse needing to cover long distances, softly and quietly. Transitions should be performed when requested, with smoothness and responsiveness. Riders are encouraged to use adequate space given the extension of gaits required. This class should show the horse's ability to work at a forward, working pace while under control by the rider. The horse shall be balanced and appear willing and a pleasure to ride in a group situation.

TRAIL - Variety of Gaits in a pattern with obstacles. The obstacles may test calmness, agility, control, willingness, and obedience.

HIGH POINTS DIVISIONS -RIDERS ARE ONLY ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE 1 HIGH POINT AND 1 RESERVE HIGH POINT AWARD PER HORSE/RIDER COMBO to **be eligible you must attend 2 shows.**

Novice No cross entry into other divisions! Geared towards riders (or horse older than 5 years) with 2 years or less of show experience. If both horse and rider have previous show experience, they are not eligible for novice. **Please leave these divisions for truly novice riders and horses to have a fun and successful introduction into showing!**

Div 1 Hunter: Required one halter or showmanship and one equitation. Must also enter at least 3 of the following classes 4, 5, 7, 9, 11 for 5 classes minimum

Div 2 Jumpers: Required one halter or showmanship and one equitation. Must also enter at least 3 of the following classes 6, 8, 10, 12, 13, 14, 15 for 5 classes

Div 3 English Colt: HORSES MUST BE 2-5 Years old. Required one halter or showmanship class. Must also enter all the following classes 30, 34, 39, 47, 85. CROSS ENTRY IS ALLOWED.

Div 4 Western Colt: HORSES MUST BE 2-5 years old. Required one halter or showmanship class. Must also enter all the following classes 57, 61, 66, 71, 80 CROSS ENTRY IS ALLOWED.

Div 5 W/T/C Youth English: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to the following required classes 26 or 27, 35 or 36, 43 or 44, 83.

Div 6 W/T/C Adult English: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to the following required classes 28, 37, 45, 84.

Div 7 W/T/L Youth Ranch Horse: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to the following required classes 53 or 54, 62 or 63, 68 or 69, 76 or 77 .

Div 8 W/T/L Adult Ranch Horse: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to the following required classes 55, 64, 67, 78.

Div 9 Novice Youth English: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to 6 of the following required classes 24, 29, 32, 38, 41, 46, 82

Div 10 Novice Youth Western: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to 5 of the following required classes 51, 56, 59, 65, 70, 79

Div 11 Novice Adult English: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to 6 of the following required classes 25, 29, 33, 38, 42, 46, 82.

Div 12 Novice Adult Western: Must enter one halter or showmanship class in addition to 5 of the following required classes 52, 56, 60, 65, 70, 79

YOUTH: Ages 17 & Under

Entry Form, Class, & Fee Explanations

Use one entry form per horse/rider combo. All horses that come to the show, even if not entering a class, must pay a Grounds Fee. If multiple riders are sharing one horse the grounds fee only needs to be paid once.

If you are entering more than 5 classes for the show, use the All-Day unlimited Classes. If you are an individual with multiple horses, you can still choose unlimited classes for individual and just pay the additional grounds fee for additional horses. If you are part of a family/household that is utilizing the unlimited family classes right already paid in the amount section.

Individual -unlimited classes~ still required to pay additional fees e.g. grounds, trail, jumping schooling

Family of 2 – unlimited classes ~ still required to pay additional fees e.g. grounds, trail, jumping schooling

Family of 3+ unlimited classes~ still required to pay additional fees e.g. grounds, trail, jumping schooling

This show series has select hunter and jumper classes where current MHJA members can earn point towards year end awards. *MHJA Administrative Fee \$5 and Per horse drug testing fee \$5 is per horse For Montana Hunter Jumper members who want classes to count towards year end points.*

Stalling and RV Information

If you have a group you desire to stall with, please note on entry form in the portion "stalling requests". Due to the large number of requests for stalls, we do not offer the option for just day stalls. If you would like to arrive on Thursday, please be aware that check-in is **after 4pm**. Earlier arrival must be communicated and approved by Jessica at 406-590-8682.

**There are a limited number of indoor stalls and they will be assigned on a first registered basis. All stalls are required to choose one of the cleaning options for the end of the event. Daily stall cleaning during the event is your responsibility *Please close your stall doors when you leave and dump your water buckets outside of your stalls.*

1) You may pay the 406 Vaulting Club \$10 to clean your stall.

2) Pay a \$20 deposit and you may clean your own stall of all hay, manure, and soiled shavings. Refund from 406 Arena will be issued once checked out at conclusion of event by office staff

**There are a limited number of RV spots available; they will be assigned on a first registered basis. Please make sure your spot is clean of garbage and manure at the conclusion of the show. If horses were tied there make any necessary repairs and adjustments to leave ground the same as arrived (e.g. holes from pawing)*

Trail fee-If you have multiple riders using the same horse for trail, fees need only be paid once per horse. Please be respectful of others and the property. Do not allow pawing in the pond. If participants wish to have access to the trail course for horses participating in the show, but not entered in any trail class, they may do so by paying the \$10 trail obstacle fee.
